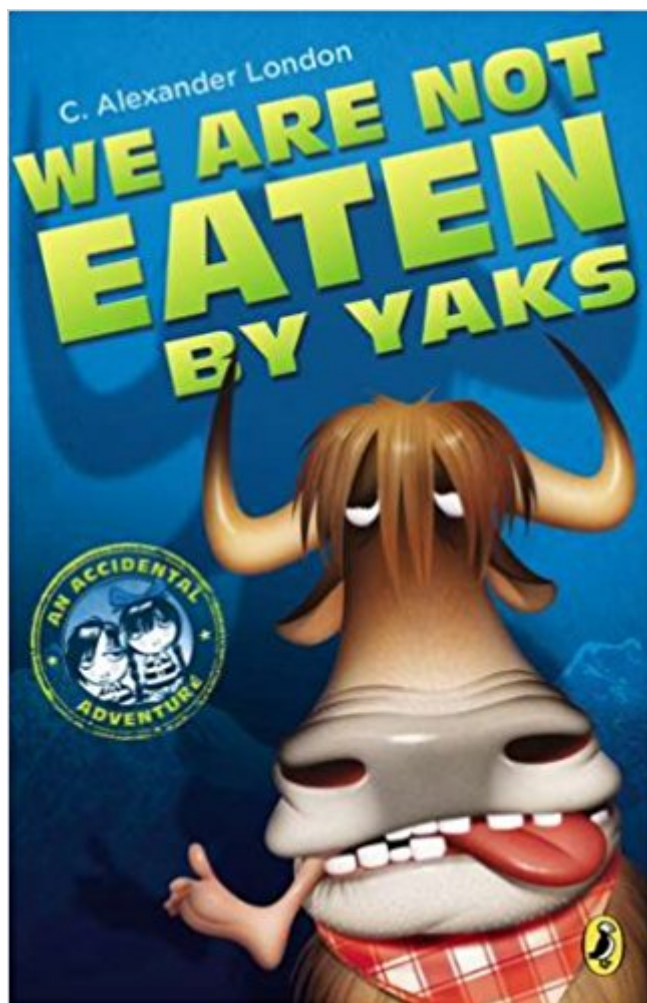


The book was found

My son was excited to read it because he thought the dad in the book sounded a lot like his dad, then I read it because I could. My son also took the book to his class to share because he was so hopped up about it and I thought we might not ever see it again, but it came back eventually. I will also say that my son, a 3rd grader, was a very reluctant reader prior to reading this book. He has

the ability to read at higher grade levels, but always tried to get away with Pokemon comic books, until he read this book. This book has relatable characters and a funny story, and I think it made him realize that books are indeed pretty awesome. Now he's tackling Percy Jackson and Narnia.

The book *An Accidental Adventure* is a great book if you like Action, Crazy, Adventure, Exploring, or TV. If I had to rate this book between 1 and 10, I would give it an 11! . This book has lots of exciting, jump out of your chair, surprises. Like the time Lama Norbru, a monk, turned out to be a grave robber who worked for Sir Edmond, or the time when their mom got them thrown out of an air plane in the middle of Tibet. But that's normal for the Navel Twins, always full of silliness and Excitement till the last page of the book. It's been a good two decades since I read a book geared towards kids (it's been a good decade since I was one), and here I was, within hours of picking up *We Are Not Eaten by Yaks*, lying in bed with a flashlight, my wife asleep next to me, as in love with reading as I was when I was a kid. This book is just tremendous fun. The Navel twins are the perfect duo of sarcastic adventurers, thrust into danger's way in the mountains of Tibet, when they'd rather just be at home, nestled up with cable. C. Alexander London, who previously wrote as a pretty serious journalist (look it up) keeps the pages flowing, one after another, with enough action, insight, and humor to keep readers on their toes. Twists and turns abound, poison witches appear, yetis wreak havoc, all the while Oliver and Celia fight to stave off boredom with the hope of reality TV's sweet embrace. If only the Navels had *An Accidental Adventure* book to read. Perhaps then they wouldn't crave cable. Awesome fun. Pure and simple. I can't wait till the next one comes out.

It's very rare that all three of my children agree on anything and this is one thing that they completely agree on. The story is funny, educational and well written. The settings are fun and intriguing (sending my children to the Atlas and Google maps). The characterization is well written

and funny. If you like humor with your adventures this is the book series for you. The couch potato frustrations of these kids are amusing and fun.

We all have days where we want to curl up on the couch and spend the afternoon with a remote in our hand. Twins Celia and Oliver Navel have that day every day. But in spite of their best intentions, and their encyclopedic knowledge of TV, their explorer-parents and a race to find the Lost Library of Alexandria tear them from their comfy couch and drop them into the wilds of Tibet. They face all kinds of dangers, confusions and complicated wagers as they struggle to get back to the safety of their apartment and a TV that might even have cable! Full of misadventures, accidental revelations and just a little bit of magic, *WE ARE NOT EATEN BY YAKS* is fun for kids AND grown-ups. Celia and Oliver (and their well-intentioned if easily distracted parents) stumble through the jungles in a mix of hilarity, sarcasm and good-old-fashioned adventure. This is Indiana Jones meets Lemony Snicket - but with only the good parts! And the real question is: ARE yaks vegetarians?!
